A. Moses

1. greatest teacher in OT
2. where he taught - mainly on Mt. Sinai
3. who he taught - the Israelites
4. why he taught - to prepare for Jesus' teaching
5. what he taught [in gen - what God revealed to him, in part.
[spec - re: ...
 - a) faith - in God [one, only, true, just, merciful, saving
[who chose Israelites to be His people.
 - b) liturgy - OT feasts, Sabbath, sacrifices, circumcision
 - c) morality - 10 comts, comt of love - Dt. 6:4, Lev. 19:18
 - d) prayer - he was ~~an~~ an example of prayer:
mostly a listening prayer, such as during 40 days on Mt. Sinai.
also [a prayer of praise & thanksgiving (Ex. 15).

B. Jesus

1. greatest teacher ever in the history of mankind.
2. where He taught - Temple, synagogues, sermon on Mt.
3. who He taught - meant for Jews & Gentiles (all people).
4. why He taught - to give us the fullness of Div. Revelation
[to set us free, for gl. of God & salv. of souls.
5. What He taught [in gen - the fullness of Div. Rev.
[spec - re: ...
 - a) faith - Δ , New People of God (Jews & Gentiles)
 - b) liturgy - NT feasts (New Passover, New Pentecost),
New Sabbath, one sacrifice, Sacraments
 - c) morality - the new comt (Jn 13 & 15), Beatitudes (Mt. 5)
 - d) prayer [He taught us the 'Our Father' (Mt. 6)
[He is the role model of prayer, especially
on Holy Th - Last supper (Jn 17), agony in garden
on Good Fri - during His crucifixion (7 last words)
